DRAFT Meeting Minutes - May 11, 2022

Call to Order:

Chair Kasemeyer called the video-conference meeting of the Interagency Commission on School Construction to order at 3:32 p.m.

Members in Attendance:

McCord, Maryland Department of Planning

1. Consent Agenda – [Motion Carried]

Upon a motion by Superintendent Choudbury, seconded by Ms. Eberhart, the IAC voted unanimously to approve the consent agenda.

A. Approval of the April 14, 2022 Minutes

To approve the minutes of the April 14, 2022 Interagency Commission on School Construction Meeting.

B. Summary of Contract Awards

To approve contract procurement as presented.

E. Washington County Technical HS Property Transfer

To approve the transfer of 11,454 square feet of land (0.2629 acres), of the parcel containing Washington County Technical High School, at 50 West Oak Ridge Drive, Hagerstown, Maryland, 21740, from the Washington County Public Schools Board of Education (WCBOE) to the Washington County Commissioners, in exchange for 190,676 square feet, or 4.37 acres, of an adjacent county-owned parcel (Tax Map 314, Grid 14, Parcel 893), known as Doub's Woods Park, to the WCBOE for the construction of a Diesel Repair educational facility at the high school.

2. Approval of IAC Meeting Bylaws – [Motion Carried]

Ms. Eberhart and Heidi Dudderar, Assistant Attorney General for the IAC, presented an overview of the IAC Bylaws that were first introduced at the April 14, 2022 IAC Meeting. Ms. Dudderar presented a revision to Article III, $\S7(b)(v)$ and Article IV, $\S2(a)(iii)$, striking "Evaluate the performance of the Executive Director in accordance with the state Performance Planning & Evaluation Program" and replace with "Evaluate the performance of the Executive Director."

Upon a motion by Ms. Eberhart, seconded by Mr. Gibbons, the IAC voted unanimously to approve the adoption of the Interagency Commission on School Construction Bylaws as presented with the proposed revisions.

3. Prince George's - William Schmidt Outdoor Educational Center - FY21/FY22 Replacement Project - Rescind and Amend FY23 - [Motion Carried]

Gene Shanholtz, IAC Regional Facilities Manager, presented the request by Prince George's County Public Schools (PGCPS) to cancel the FY 2021 and FY 2022 Replacement/Renovation project at William Schmidt Outdoor Educational Center and amend the FY 2023 Replacement/Renovation project at the William Schmidt Outdoor Educational Center. According to PGCPS, the project has faced several challenges exacerbated by the pandemic and enhanced regulatory review required due to the uniqueness of the site in comparison to other more typical school buildings leading to delays in the overall schedule. By rescinding the allocations and amending the FY 2023 CIP to include the project, PGCPS expects to have sufficient time to execute the project.

Upon a motion by Ms. Eberhart, seconded by Secretary Churchill, the IAC voted unanimously:

- To approve the cancellation of Prince George's County Public School (PGCPS) FY 2021 William Schmidt Outdoor Educational Center Replacement/Renovation Project (PSC# 16.199.21);
- To approve the cancellation of Prince George's County Public School (PGCPS) FY 2022 William Schmidt Outdoor Educational Center Replacement/Renovation Project (PSC# 16.199.22);
- 3. Transfer the State allocation totaling \$19,037,000 to the LEA's Reserved Prior Year Appropriations Account;
- 4. Amend the FY 2023 CIP and apply \$19,037,000 from the Reserved Prior Year Appropriations account to the FY 2023 William Schmidt Outdoor Educational Center Replacement/Renovation Project (PSC# 16.199.23).



4. Baltimore City – Rescission and Amendment of Five Projects to FY 2023 Capital Improvement Program – [Motion Carried]

Gricel Muñoz, IAC Regional Facilities Manager, presented the request by Baltimore City Public Schools (BCPSS) to rescind and amend five HVAC, Multi Systemic, and Roof projects from FY21 CIP and amend to FY23 CIP, with increases in project cost ranging from 35 to 50 percent. BCPSS was unable to complete the design and proceed to award contracts before the two year statutory time frame, due to challenges regarding COVID and inflation within labor and materials, and equipment delays. BCPSS requests to rescind and amend these projects into FY23 CIP and use additional funds from their prior year reserved appropriations account to cover the increases.

Upon a motion by Secretary Churchill, seconded by Superintendent Choudhury, the IAC voted unanimously to:

- 1. To approve the rescission of five (5) Baltimore City Schools FY 2021 Capital Improvement Program projects;
- 2. Transfer the State allocation totaling \$ 28,666,000 to the LEA's Reserved Prior Year Appropriations Account;
- 3. Amend the FY2023 CIP to include the five (5) Baltimore City Schools projects including design funding only for two projects and full funding for three projects, including estimated increases.
- 4. Apply \$23,991,960 from the Reserved Prior Year Appropriations Account to the FY 2023 CIP for the five projects as presented in Table 2.

5. FY 2023 100% Capital Improvement Program - [Motion Carried]

Arabia Davis, IAC Funding Programs Manager, presented IAC staff recommendations for 100% of the school construction allocation for the FY 2023 CIP. Staff recommended the approval of a total of \$412 million, including funding for 116 projects, which includes costs to cover design and planning services for 4 projects and planning approval for a total of 14 projects, and a total of \$4.2 million to be reserved, for the 100% allocation round based on the Governor's Capital Budget.

Upon a motion by Secretary Churchill, seconded by Ms. Eberhart, the IAC voted unanimously:

- 1. To approve the Fiscal Year 2023 Capital Improvement Program in the total amount of \$416 million, including \$412 million for allocation to funding and planning projects, \$.5 million for Department of General Services (DGS) design consultant fees and reserving \$3.779 million in new authorization for unanticipated project costs; and
- 2. To authorize the IAC staff to make minor adjustments to allocations based on calculation of the project's net state funding amount to avoid the over or under funding of a project.

6. Baltimore City Extra \$15 Million for HVAC Project Status Report - [Informational Only]

Ms. Muñoz provided an update that 16 of 19 HVAC projects are operational while three remain in progress. Callaway Elementary School is in the final design and procurement phase, with an anticipated construction start date of July 2022 and completion in July 2023. Thomas Johnson Elementary/Middle School is under construction with an anticipated project completion date of August 2022. Windsor Hills Elementary/Middle School is under construction with an anticipated project completion date of August 2022. Funds have been fully allocated to the projects, 90% have been contracted, and 83% have been expended.



Cyndi Smith, BCPSS Director of Facilities, Design and Construction, explained that the Callaway project started as replacement of ventilators but beginning in design and field work, they found several additional needs. BCPSS reevaluated the project to resolve the issues in the whole school instead of addressing small parts one at a time. Furthermore, Thomas Johnson and Windsor Hill projects experienced material delays. The factors they learned will be able to help with future projects.

7. Baltimore City Revised Enhanced Approval Package – #27 Commodore John Rodgers Elementary/Middle School - [Motion Carried]

Ms. Muñoz presented the revision to BCPSS's Enhanced Approval Packages (EAP) for Commodore John Rodgers Elementary/ Middle School. In accordance with the Memorandum of Understanding, the process approval of the project was approved by the IAC on November 15, 2018. In November 2021, the EAP was revised to change the project type from an addition/renovation to a full replacement project. Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners approved the revised EAP on May 10, 2022. Fred Mason, MSDE Office of School Facilities Director, explained that this project showcases the evolution of a project and collaboration between BCPSS, Maryland Stadium Authority, and MSDE to realize that a replacement is better in the long-term and for the students than a renovation for this project. Commission members commended the amount of effort that is put into these projects and the work that is produced.

Upon a motion by Secretary McCord, seconded by Ms. Eberhart, the IAC voted unanimously to approve the revisions made to the Enhanced Approval Package (EAP) for #27 Commodore John Rodgers Elementary/ Middle School dated November 2021.

8. Cecil Manor ES FY 21 and 22 HVAC project Cancellation - [Motion Carried]

Eileen Gladd, Regional Facilities Manager, presented Cecil County Public Schools (CCPS) request to cancel the Cecil Manor Elementary School HVAC replacement project. CCPS rejected all bids for the project because the lowest potential bid was 30% higher than the estimated budget, and CCPS was unable to fund the local share overage. CCPS intends to resubmit the project with an adjusted cost as part of their FY 2024 CIP submission. Upon questions from the Commission members, IAC staff confirmed that the project estimates were from 2019, prior to the COVID pandemic, for the FY 2021 funding cycle. Commission members further discussed that this trend is going to be more common with price increases across the industry. IAC staff is monitoring the costs of bids. The major issues identified are increases in construction demand in combination with supply chain disruptions, both driving up cost. Costs are expected to settle within 8 to 10 months.

Upon a motion by Secretary McCord, seconded by Mr. Gibbons, the IAC voted unanimously to approve the cancellation of Cecil County Public School's (CCPS) FY 2021/FY 2022 Cecil Manor HVAC Project (PSC# 07.030.21/22SR) and transfer the State's allocation totaling \$1,597,000 to the LEAs Reserved Prior Year Appropriations Account.

9. Montgomery - Built To Learn Poolesville High School Project Revision - [Motion Carried]
Ms. Davis presented a Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS) revision request for the
Poolesville High School Addition/Renovation project budget that includes prevailing wages. Upon
questions from the commission members, IAC staff explained that anything with less than 25% State
share is not required to pay prevailing wage, and some LEAs specifically request just under this
threshold of funding. MCPS initially submitted their project request at under 25% funding, but later



adjusted their request to a higher cost that represents the State share of the total eligible cost, including prevailing wage. The IAC reported in December 2020 to the Governor and General Assembly that prevailing wage increases school construction costs by 8% to 12%.

Upon a motion by Ms. Eberhart, seconded by Mr. Gibbons, the IAC voted unanimously to approve the revisions to a previously approved project as presented to be funded and executed through the Built to Learn Act. The total revised allocation increases the project by \$20,227,000. Final funding amounts are subject to adjustment based upon finalization of project worksheets and review of project eligibility.

10. Public School Enrollment Projections - [Informational Only]

Jamie Bridges, IAC Planning Manager, and Alfred Sundara, MDP Projections and State Data Center Manager, presented general information on the development and use of enrollment projections, as well as details on statewide public school enrollment projections for 2022-2031.

Commission members discussed the trends currently being seen in Maryland and across the country with the increase in homeschooling and private school enrollment, and a decline in public school enrollment. Across the country, a decrease in births will erode school enrollment in the future. Members noted that some LEAs have expressed difficulty with enrollment declines during the pandemic and their inability to bring students back to the public system. It is hard to predict how many homeschoolers will make the transition back to public schools. Commission members requested data on homeschooling changes by county, MDP and IAC staff will supply that information to the members.

11. HB1290 and FY 2023 Budget - Informational Only

Chair Kasemeyer postponed the item until the June 9, 2022 IAC Meeting.

12. Executive Session - [Motion Carried]

Pursuant to § 3-305(b)(1) of the General Provisions Article, Annotated Code of Maryland, and with unanimous agreement by all members present, the Interagency Commission met in closed session on Wednesday, May 11, 2022 to discuss personnel matters. All members were present at the closed session with the exception of Mr. Lombardo and Ms. Lawlah. Also in attendance was Cassandra Viscarra, Deputy Director for Administration, and Ms. Dudderar. The Executive Session commenced at 4:47 p.m.

The Executive Session concluded at 5:01 p.m. Chair Kasemeyer explained that the closed session was to discuss the appointment of an acting Executive Director upon Executive Director Gorrell's retirement. Additionally, the commission members created a Search Committee for a permanent Executive Director that will include Chair Kasemeyer, Ms. Eberhart, Mr. Gibbons, and Secretary Churchill.

Upon a motion by Superintendent Choudhury, seconded by Mr. Gibbons, the IAC voted unanimously to appoint Alex Donahue, who is the Commission's Deputy Director for Field Operations, as Acting Executive Director, beginning June 1, 2022 and continuing until a new Executive Director is appointed and begins working in that position.



Announcements:

Chair Kasemeyer and members of the Commission presented Executive Director Gorrell with a plaque and Governor's citation in honor of his retirement. They wished him a farewell and good fortune in his retirement.

Adjournment:

Upon a motion by Mr. Gibbons, with a second by Superintendent Choudhury, the IAC voted unanimously to adjourn the meeting at 5:12 p.m.

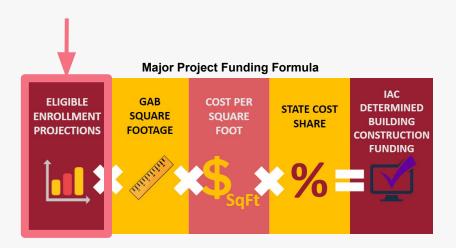

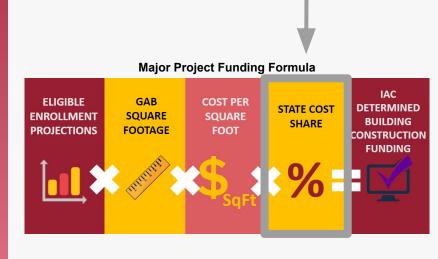

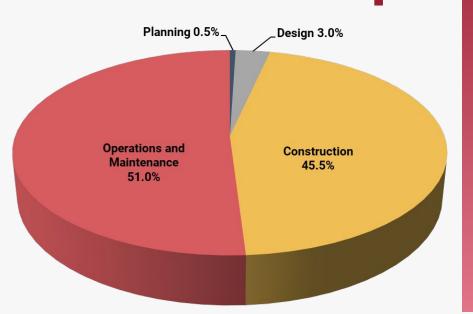

The expected lifespan of a school facility (including appropriate renewals) is 50 to 60 years.

TCO takes into consideration the costs associated with the full life cycle of a school facility.

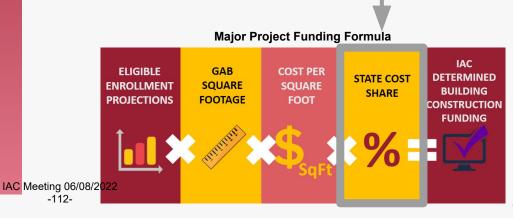
Includes: **Planning, Design, Construction**, and **Operations/Maintenance** phases.

The best practice is to consider total cost of ownership at every project stage.



- HB 1290 provides for a TCO incentive
- Projects that have an estimated TCO that is at least 15% less than the baseline TCO as developed by the IAC get a 5% increase in the State share for the project
- Actual must meet threshold one year after or 5% increase must be repaid
- IAC required to develop life cycle cost analysis standards and adopt regulations to carry out TCO incentive program

School Construction Revolving Loan Fund

- Purpose is to provide loans to local governments to forward fund the State or Local share of school construction projects that the local government:
 - needs help to fund in order to complete a project
 - Is able to repay the loan (if required)
 - For projects that have received local planning approval
 - Priority given to counties that haven't forward-funded projects and that have limited debt capacity
 - Repayment within 5 years
 - IAC may establish a procedure to grant a waiver
 - Governor must fund \$40 m in FY 2023, \$20 m in FY 2024, and \$10 m per year in FY 2025 and 2026
 - Can be used for BTL or CIP



IAC Meeting 06/08/2022

- Currently in statute to provide for school construction projects that improve the health of school facilities; provides \$40 million per year through FY 2024
- HB 1290
 - Extends Healthy School Facility Fund to FY 2026 (rather than FY 2024)
 - Requires the Governor to appropriate at least \$90 million in FY 2024 through FY 2026
 - For FY 2021 through 2026 (was 2024) Baltimore City shall be awarded 50% of the funds appropriated

- Allows IAC to provide Prince George's P3 funding to the LEA rather than the vendor

Item 7. Proposed COMAR Amendments

Motion:

To approve amendments to COMAR 14.39.02.05 as presented in this item and to authorize staff to make additional technical edits as necessary. The proposed COMAR revisions will be published in the Maryland Register and will be open for public comment for a period of at least 30 days before returning to the IAC for final approval.

Background Information:

Based upon the enactment of 2022 MD Laws, Ch. 32, IAC staff recommend revisions to COMAR 14.39.02.05 as described in this summary and as presented in the attached text. New provisions include:

- 1. Reductions in the cost share shall not exceed 5 percent pursuant to Ed. Art. §5-303(d)(5)(ii).
- 2. Increase of 10 percent in LEA's State cost share if the proposed school construction project is at a school with a concentration of poverty level, as defined in Education Article §5-223, Annotated Code of Maryland, of 80% or greater pursuant to §5-303(k)(3)(i).
- 3. Increase of 5 percent in LEA's State cost share if the proposed school construction project is at a school with a concentration of poverty level, as defined in Education Article §5-223, Annotated Code of Maryland, of less than 80% but greater than 55% pursuant to §5-303(k)(3)(ii).
- 4. Increase of 5 percent in LEA's State cost share if the proposed school construction project is at a school that, in the most recent school maintenance effectiveness assessment pursuant to §5-303(k)(3)(iii).
- 5. Increase of 5 percent in LEA's State cost share if the proposed school construction project is a net-zero school pursuant to §5-303(k)(3)(iv).

Title 14 INDEPENDENT AGENCIES

Subtitle 39 INTERAGENCY COMMISSION ON SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION

Chapter 02 Administration of the Public School Construction Program

Authority: Education Article, §§4-126, 5-112, and 5-303; State Finance and Procurement Article, §5-7B-07; Annotated Code of Maryland

.05 State Cost Share Percentage.

- A. The State may fund eligible costs of approved public school construction projects according to the State cost share percentage established in this regulation.
 - B. Percentages.
 - (1) The minimum State share of public school construction funding for eligible costs of approved projects is 50 percent.
- (2) Reductions in the cost share that exceed -5 percent shall be phased in over 2 years so that a 1-year reduction in the cost share percentage does not exceed -5 percent shall not exceed 5 percent.
 - (3) The maximum State share of public school construction funding is 100 percent of eligible costs of approved projects.
 - [(3)] (4) The State share percentage for the Maryland School for the Blind shall be 93 percent of eligible costs of approved projects. C. Revisions to Percentages.
- (1) By October 2018 and every 2 years thereafter, the IAC shall update, approve, and publish to the IAC's website the cost share percentage to be applied to projects submitted for approval in the Fiscal Year.
- (2) The IAC shall use the formula in [C(3)] D(1) of this regulation to recommend revisions to the State cost share percentage for each county.

D. LEA State Cost Share

- [(3)] (1) The IAC shall add the following amounts to calculate the recommended revised cost share amounts:
- (a) The LEA's current State share of the Foundation program divided by the Foundation program of the LEA as defined under Education Article, §5-202, Annotated Code of Maryland;
- (b) The current amount of State aid provided to the LEA by the guaranteed tax base program as defined under Education Article, §5-210, Annotated Code of Maryland, divided by the Foundation program of the LEA;
- (c) 20 percent of the amount by which the LEA's free and reduced price meal percentage exceeds the Statewide free and reduced price meal percentage in the prior school year;
- (d) 5 percent if the county where the LEA is located is a Tier I county that has an unemployment rate greater than the average rate or number of percentage points identified in Economic Development Article, §1-101, Annotated Code of Maryland, or has met the average rate or number of percentage points identified in Economic Development Article, §1-101, Annotated Code of Maryland, at some time during the preceding 24-month period;
- (e) 5 percent if the county where the LEA is located is a Tier I county that has a median household income level below the level identified in Economic Development Article, §1-101, Annotated Code of Maryland, or has had a median household income level below the level identified in Economic Development Article, §1-101, Annotated Code of Maryland, at some time during the preceding 24-month period;
- (f) The difference between the percent growth in the LEA's full-time equivalent enrollment, as defined by Education Article, \$5-202, Annotated Code of Maryland, from the 6th prior year to the prior year, and the percent growth in the Statewide full-time equivalent enrollment from the 6th prior year to the prior year, provided this calculation results in a positive number; and
- (g) 10 times the amount by which the county's and local board's total outstanding school construction debt at the end of the 2nd prior fiscal year plus the county's total school construction expenditures from its operating budget from the 4th to the 2nd prior fiscal years exceeds 1 percent of the county wealth, as defined by Education Article, §5-202, Annotated Code of Maryland, for the prior fiscal year.
 - E. Project Based Add-Ons to State Cost Share
 - (1) The IAC shall add the following amounts to an LEA's State Cost share of a proposed school construction project as applicable.

 (a) 10 percent if the proposed school construction project, when the LEA submits the project for approval to the IAC, is at a
- school with a concentration of poverty level, as defined in Education Article §5-223, Annotated Code of Maryland, of 80% or greater;
- (b) 5 percent if the proposed school construction project, when the LEA submits the project for approval to the IAC, is at a school with a concentration of poverty level, as defined in Education Article §5-223, Annotated Code of Maryland, of less than 80% but greater than 55%;
- (c) 5 percent if the proposed school construction project is at a school that, in the most recent school maintenance effectiveness assessment by the IAC, received an assessment rating of:
 - (i) Good;
 - (ii) Superior; or
 - (iii) Adequate and the school's current school facility assessment percent of expected useful life is at least 120%.
 - (d) 5 percent if the proposed school construction project is a net-zero school.

1. Background

2022 Md. Laws, Ch. 344 (SB 291) appropriated \$237 million to be distributed to specified Local Education Agencies (LEAs) for school construction projects selected by each County government that did not receive funding from the Interagency Commission on School Construction (IAC) in FY 2023 or a prior fiscal year. These funds are statutorily required to be allocated as block grants to the LEAs with minimal oversight by the IAC.

2. Allocations - General

2.1. General

2.1.1. Allocations are required to be distributed as follows:

LEA	Allocation Amount	
Baltimore City	\$75,000,000	
Baltimore County	\$80,000,000	
Charles County	\$5,000,000	
Frederick County	\$10,000,000	
Howard County	\$35,000,000	
Prince George's County	\$30,000,000	

2.1.2. Additionally, \$2 million is available to be allocated to a County or Counties that are not specified in the table above and are not eligible for an increase in the gross area baseline for projects funded through the Built to Learn Act of 2020 as provided in Economic Development Article, § 10-650(c)(2). The IAC will distribute the funding based on each eligible County's proportionate share of the final full time equivalent enrollment as of September 30, 2021 (see attachment 1).

2.2. Project Eligibility and Allocation Basis

- 2.2.1. Funds may only be applied to projects selected by the County Government.
- 2.2.2. Projects that received or subsequently receive any allocation of State funds by the IAC under any other IAC-administered program in FY 2023 or a prior fiscal year are ineligible for funding.
- 2.2.3. Funding shall be provided without a local match.
- 2.2.4. Because the Pass Through Grant (PTG) funds are general-obligation (G0) bond funds, all items purchased with these funds must have a median lifespan of at least 15 years.

3. Application and Approval Procedures

- 3.1. LEAs should complete the SB 291 Pass-Through Funding Application (.xlsx) and submit to iac.pscp@maryland.gov before May 1, 2023.
- 3.2. IAC staff will review applications to ensure projects are eligible for funding in accordance with Section 2.2 of this procedures guide, and notify the LEA within 10 days of the eligibility determination
- 3.3. The application will be deemed incomplete unless signed by an authorized LEA representative AND County Government representative.
- 3.4. Applications shall be submitted to iac.pscp@maryland.gov with the subject "[County] SB 291 Pass-Through Funding Application" prior to May 1, 2023. Please submit the unsigned excel version of the application as well as a signed PDF version of the form.

4. Procurement

4.1. Procurements shall be in compliance with all applicable Federal, State, and Local requirements.

5. Grant Processing, Distribution, and Financial Reporting

- 5.1. Upon receipt of an application and subsequent verification by the IAC that the submitted project(s) are eligible, the IAC will process a block grant payment to the LEA for the requested amount.
- 5.2. LEAs will be required to report expenditures and project progress to the IAC twice per year as determined by the IAC and in a format provided by the IAC.

6. **Project Closeout**

- 6.1. Bond funds are subject to reversion if not expended within 7 years of allocation. LEAs shall ensure all funds are expended and closeout requirements are met by May 1, 2029.
- 6.2. Within 18 months of the LEA's final payment to the contractor, the LEA shall submit to the IAC the contract documents and all pay applications for work performed with SB 291 Pass-Through Grant Funding.
- 6.3. IAC will perform a financial audit and may require a reimbursement to the State if all provided funds are not demonstrated to have been expended for projects authorized by the IAC.

2022 Update to the October 8, 2021 Report on the Status of Air Conditioning in Maryland's School Facilities

In October 2021, the IAC provided a report on the status of air conditioning in Maryland's School Facilities. In response to recent questions about Air Conditioning, the IAC provides the following update.

- As of October 2021, 31 schools in Maryland had 20% or more of classrooms unairconditioned.
- As of June 1, 2022, 26 schools in service remain unairconditioned, with 100% of those schools owned by LEAs either receiving HVAC projects or slated for HVAC projects.
