DRAFT Meeting Minutes – April 20, 2023

Call to Order:

Chair Kasemeyer called the video-conference meeting of the Interagency Commission on School Construction to order at 9:01 a.m.

Members in Attendance:

Edward Kasemeyer, Appointee of the President of the Senate, Chair Linda Eberhart, Appointee of the Speaker of the House, Vice-chair Secretary Atif Chaudhry, Maryland Department of General Services Michael Darenberg, Appointee of the Governor Secretary Rebecca Flora, Maryland Department of Planning Brian Gibbons, Appointee of the Speaker of the House Gloria Lawlah, Appointee of the President of the Senate

Members Not in Attendance:

1. Overview of the Blueprint for Maryland's Future – [Informational Only]

Rachel Hise, Executive Director of the Blueprint for Maryland's Future Accountability and Implementation Board, presented the history, purpose, and current progress of the Blueprint.

2. Executive Director Report - [Informational Only]

Alex Donahue, IAC Executive Director, provided an update on House Bill 458, which has passed both chambers and has been sent to the Governor to be signed. Additionally, Mr. Donahue provided an update on the IAC's Blueprint Facilities Workgroup. The Workgroup will be extended to address topics in more detail.

3. Consent Agenda – [Motion Carried]

Upon a motion by Mr. Darenberg, seconded by Ms. Lawlah, the IAC voted unanimously to approve the consent agenda.

A. Approval of the March 9, 2023 Minutes

To approve the minutes of the March 9, 2023 Interagency Commission on School Construction Meeting.



B. Contract Awards

To approve contract procurement as presented.

C. Property Transfer – Harford County Public Schools – Lot 2

To approve the transfer of 5.369 acres of Lot 2 at 351 Lewis Lane, Havre de Grace, Harford County from the Harford County Board of Education to the Harford County Council for use as the Boys & Girls Clubs of Harford and Cecil Counties - Havre de Grace Club.

4. Approval of IAC Executive Director Performance Evaluation Policy and Form – [Motion Carried] Vice-chair Eberhart presented a new policy that outlines the annual evaluation process of the IAC Executive Director's performance. Mr. Donahue confirmed his involvement and support of the policy.

Upon a motion by Mr. Gibbons, seconded by Ms. Lawlah, the IAC voted unanimously to approve the adoption of the Interagency Commission on School Construction Executive Director Performance Evaluation Policy and FY 2023 Executive Director Evaluation Form as presented.

5. Built to Learn Project Approval – Baltimore City Schools – City Springs PreK-8 #008 Replacement – [Motion Carried]

Melissa Wilfong, IAC Senior Regional Facilities Manager, presented Baltimore City Schools' request for Built to Learn funding of \$19 million for the City Springs PreK-8 #008. Per statute, the project can not receive more than 6% of City Schools' total BTL allocation, and this request ensures that this value will not exceed this threshold. The school will house the Conversion Charter school and have an anticipated capacity of 954 students.

Upon a motion by Ms. Lawlah, seconded by Vice-chair Eberhart, the IAC voted unanimously to approve Baltimore City Schools' Built to Learn funding request for the City Springs PreK-8 #008 (30.202) Replacement project with a Maximum State Allocation of up to \$21,692,000, contingent upon the final total Baltimore City BTL allocation and to allocate State Built to Learn program funding of \$19,000,000, which does not exceed the 6% required by Economic Development Article §10–650(b)(2). Approval of an estimated 3,000 square feet of community use space is conditional upon City Schools providing acceptable verification documentation as required by the Administrative Procedures Guide.

6. Pass-Through Grant Administrative Procedure Guide Revisions - Motion Carried

Cassandra Viscarra, IAC Deputy Director for Administration, presented revisions to the Pass-Through Grant (PTG) Administrative Procedures Guide. The revisions clarified that PTG funds have to be used for schools providing educational services and change orders on projects eligible for PTG funding. The revisions further update LEA reporting criteria.

Upon a motion by Mr. Darenberg, seconded by Mr. Gibbons, the IAC voted unanimously to approve revisions to the Pass-Through Grant Administrative Procedures Guide as presented to clarify definition of eligible school projects, define eligibility of change orders, and update reporting requirements, and to authorize staff to make non-substantive edits.



7. Pass-Through Grant Funding Approvals – [Motion Carried]

Arabia Davis, IAC Funding Programs Manager, presented requests from Dorchester, Garrett, Howard, and Worcester Counties for several projects totaling \$35 million. All projects presented have met the requirements of the program and are eligible for funding. The deadline for PTG funding applications is May 1, 2023.

Upon a motion by Vice-chair Eberhart, seconded by Ms Lawlah, the IAC voted unanimously to approve the Pass-Through Grant program projects as presented with a total allocation of \$35,152,135 subject to reconciliation and potential adjustment at project closeout.

8. Aging Schools Program Administrative Procedures Guide and Schedule for Applications – [Motion Carried]

Ms. Viscarra presented revisions to the Aging Schools Program (ASP) Administrative Procedures Guide (APG) and the opening of applications for Fiscal Year 2024. ASP is a statutory program that provides \$6.1 million to LEAs. The revisions to the APG set clear expectations for LEAs, allow IAC staff better management of workload, and update the prevailing wage threshold in accordance with statutory changes.

Upon a motion by Mr. Gibbons, seconded by Secretary Chaudhry, the IAC voted unanimously:

- 1. To approve the Aging Schools Program (ASP) Administrative Procedures Guide, and to authorize IAC staff to make non substantive edits as needed;
- 2. To open the FY 2024 ASP application period and direct staff to solicit ASP projects from LEAs with a maximum total allocation of \$6,109,000 in accordance with the FY 2024 State budget, plus any available funds from prior year allocations; and
- To delegate authority to approve eligible projects within each total LEA allocation to IAC staff and Designees, with a report of project allocations submitted to the IAC periodically at regularly scheduled meetings.
- 9. FY 2022 Aging Schools Program Rescission Baltimore County Public Schools [Motion Carried] Ms. Davis presented Baltimore County Public Schools' request to rescind FY 2022 Aging Schools Program funding totaling \$865K for the Perry Hall High and Woodmoor Elementary Intercom Replacement Projects and to reserve the funding for future distribution due to revised project scopes and increased construction costs.

Upon a motion by Ms. Lawlah, seconded by Vice-chair Eberhart, the IAC voted unanimously to approve the cancellation of two Baltimore County Public Schools intercom projects funded in the Fiscal Year 2022 Aging Schools Program (ASP); and, to reserve the funding for future distribution to eligible projects in the FY 2024 ASP.

10. Gross Area Baseline Variance - Anne Arundel County Public Schools - Park Elementary School - [Motion Carried]

Ms. Wilfong presented Anne Arundel County Public Schools' request for a Gross Area Baseline variance of 8,000 GSF for the Park Elementary School project to fund a classroom addition.

Upon a motion by Ms. Lawlah, seconded by Mr. Darenberg, the IAC voted to approve a Gross Area Baseline variance for an additional 8,000 gross square feet at Anne Arundel County's Park Elementary School (PSC 02.076) in support of a potential six classroom addition. This increases the eligible



building area from 76,047 to 84,047 gross square feet based upon a total projected enrollment of 642 students.

11. FY 2021 Capital Improvement Program Cancellation and FY 2022 Amendment – Montgomery County Public Schools - Ronald McNair Elementary – [Motion Carried]

Ms. Davis presented Montgomery County Public Schools' (MCPS) request to amend the FY 2021 CIP to rescind funding applied to the Ronald McNair HVAC project and reallocate the available funds to the FY 2022 CIP Ronald McNair HVAC project to cover the increased budget.

Upon a motion by Ms. Lawlah, seconded by Ms. Eberhart, the IAC voted unanimously to rescind the Fiscal Year 2021 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Ronald McNair Elementary School HVAC project and transfer the allocation of \$487,000 to the Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS) Prior Year Reserved Appropriation Account; and to approve the reallocation of \$487,000 from the MCPS Prior Year Appropriation Account to the FY 2022 CIP Ronald McNair Elementary School HVAC project, increasing the State Share from \$975,000 to \$1,462,000.

12. FY 2022 and FY 2023 Capital Improvement Program Rescission Requests – Baltimore City Public Schools – [Motion Carried]

Ms. Davis presented Baltimore City Public Schools' (City Schools) request to rescind funding from several projects approved in FY 2022 and 2023 CIP and revert the funding to City Schools' LEA reserve account for future use.

Upon a motion by Ms. Lawlah, seconded by Mr. Gibbons, the IAC voted unanimously:

- 1. To approve the rescission of eight Baltimore City Public Schools (City Schools) projects funded in the FY 2022 Capital Improvement Program (CIP);
- 2. To approve the rescission of \$15,000,000 approved for allocation in the FY 2022 and FY 2023 CIP and reapply for future redistribution to the FY 2024 CIP Armistead Gardens PreK-8 School #243 addition/renovation project; and
- 3. To transfer \$49,437,000 to the LEA's reserve appropriations account for future redistribution.

13. FY 2023 Capital Improvement Program Rescission – Harford County Public Schools – Harford Technical High School – [Motion Carried]

Ms. Davis presented Harford County Public Schools request to rescind FY 2023 CIP local planning approval and funding for the Harford Technical High School Limited Renovation project due to the fluctuating condition of the construction market.

Upon a motion by Ms. Lawlah, seconded by Vice-chair Eberhart, the IAC voted unanimously to approve the rescission of Harford County Public Schools' (HCPS) FY 2023 CIP Harford Technical High School (PSC 12.008) Limited Renovation planning and construction allocation totaling \$10 Million, and to subsequently transfer the rescinded funds into the reserve account designated for HCPS.

14. Healthy Schools Facility Fund FY 2021, FY 2022, and FY 2023 Project Realignments and Extensions – [Motion Carried]

Ms. Davis and Gene Shanholtz, IAC Regional Facilities Manager, presented requests from Calvert, Carroll, and Garrett Counties to extend the Healthy School Facility Fund program deadlines due to unanticipated project delays and realignment funding for projects that came in with significantly



higher construction costs due to recent bid results. In response to a question from Commission members, Staff confirmed that Sunderland Elementary School is fully air conditioned and the project will replace the current unit that has reached the end of its expected useful life.

Upon a motion by Mr. Darenberg, seconded by Ms. Eberhart, the IAC voted unanimously:

- 1. To approve the realignment of Healthy Schools Facility Fund (HSFF) funding allocations for projects in Calvert County, Carroll County, and Garrett County as presented;
- 2. To extend the encumbrance deadline for the Westminster High project from June 1, 2023 to December 31, 2023;
- 3. To extend the deadline for funds to be expended for the Sunderland Elementary School Chiller/Rooftop Unit project from October 3, 2023 to June 3, 2024; and
- 4. To extend the reimbursement submission deadline for the Sunderland Elementary School Chiller/Rooftop Unit project from May 1, 2024 to August 1, 2024.

15. Approval of Adjustment to Maximum State Allocation - Baltimore City Public Schools - Furley Elementary School - [Motion Carried]

Mr. Shanholtz presented Baltimore City Public Schools' request to adjust the Maximum State Allocation for the Furley Elementary School replacement project due to market conditions and the ongoing escalation of construction costs. The project received local planning approval in Fiscal Year 2021 and \$12 million in funding from the Fiscal Year 2022 and 2023 CIPs. Commission members questioned if the increase is consistent with the current inflation. Staff confirmed when the project was approved that the price per square foot was locked into fiscal year 2022 rates and the increase would reflect the current status of the construction market.

Upon a motion by Ms Lawlah, seconded by Vice-chair Eberhart, the IAC voted unanimously to approve Baltimore City Public Schools' request to increase the Maximum State Allocation for Furley Elementary School from \$27,446,000 to \$42,852,000, based upon bids received pursuant to COMAR 14.39.02.07C and to include funding for design & furniture, fixtures, and equipment as reflected in the presented project worksheet.

16. Nonpublic Aging Schools Program – FY 2023 Project Approvals and Allocations – [Motion Carried] Myron Mason, MSDE School Facilities Program Officer, presented the FY 2022 allocations for the Nonpublic Aging Schools Program, totaling \$3,499,998.38. Commission members inquired about the low available funds. Staff explained that the funds appropriated by the legislature are consistent with previous years and the amount is specified in the annual budget bill.

Upon a motion by Ms. Lawlah, seconded by Vice-chair Eberhart, the IAC voted unanimously to approve FY 2023 Senator James E. "Ed" DeGrange Nonpublic Aging Schools Program project allocations as presented, totaling \$3,499,998.38.

17. FY 2024 Capital Improvement Program Supplemental Information Report – [Informational Only]

Jillian Storms, MSDE Office of School Facilities Acting Director, presented an overview of information gathered from LEAs as part of the FY 2024 CIP submission process, including air conditioning availability in classrooms, number of design and planning professionals on staff, open space instructional areas, and number of relocatable classrooms per LEA. Commission members requested further information on the funding and future use of relocatable classrooms. Staff explained that the



State no longer provides relocatables. The State owns approximately 99 relocatables, the majority of which have exceeded their useful life and will be demolished when no longer in use.

18. Legislative Update - [Informational Only]

Ms. Viscarra presented an overview of the bills that are of interest to the IAC that were approved by both chambers during the 2023 legislative session and sent to the Governor for signing.

Announcements:

Chair Kasemeyer mentioned that during the budget hearing in Annapolis, the IAC committed to meeting with LEAs and County Government officials throughout the year to engage in discussion.

Adjournment:

Upon a motion by Mr. Darenberg, with a second by Secretary Chaudhry, the IAC voted unanimously to adjourn the meeting at 10:36 a.m.

Background Information:

2022 Md. Laws, Ch. 344 (SB 291) appropriated \$237 million to be distributed to specified Local Education Agencies (LEAs) for school construction projects selected by each County. These Pass-Through Grant (PTG) funds are statutorily required to be allocated as block grants to the LEAs with minimal oversight by the IAC.

The IAC approved the PTG Administrative Procedures Guide on June 8, 2022 and subsequent revisions on August 11, 2022 and April 20, 2023. To be eligible, projects must be selected by the County Government. The funds cannot be used to replace the local share of projects that have received funding from other IAC programs but may be combined with other State funded projects so long as the appropriate local match requirements are met. The IAC will complete project reconciliation and close out and if the local match requirement has not been met, the State may require a refund. PTG funds are provided without the requirement of a local match in accordance with the budget bill.

IAC staff have presented projects to the IAC for approval on a rolling basis with funds required to be allocated within FY 2023. PTG applications require authorization by a LEA representative and County Government representative. IAC staff have reviewed and recommended approval.






Historical Public School Enrollment in Maryland, 2012 - 2022





Historical Annual Change in Total Public School Enrollment in Maryland, 2011 - 2022 *





Historical Public and Non-Public Enrollment in Maryland, 2011 - 2022













Cumulative Births by School Year in Maryland Historical & Projected, 1972 - 2032 *








Item 4. Priority Funding Area Waiver - Calvert County Public Schools - Northern Middle School

Motion:

Approve the Priority Funding Area (PFA) Waiver Request for the Calvert County Public Schools Northern Middle School (PSC 04.006) Replacement project.

Background Information:

IAC staff received a PFA waiver request from Calvert County Public Schools on April 6, 2023. COMAR 14.39.02.03 C. requires that when an LEA proposes to build a new school or to increase the State-rated capacity of a replacement school outside of a PFA, the LEA shall request a waiver in accordance with Regulation .29 of this chapter for approval of planning and funding. The Northern Middle School project will replace the existing facility, is outside of a PFA, and will also increase the State Rated Capacity.

The IAC Designees met on April 11, 2023 to evaluate the request, taking into consideration factors detailed in COMAR 14.39.02.30 C. Notable factors include the rural setting that is not currently served by public water and sewer, the co-location of the existing Northern Middle School on the same site as Northern High School, and the substantial State and Local investments towards the Northern High School Replacement project (State Funding totalling \$34,258,000 in FY 2017, 2018, and 2019 CIP) as well as the new Wastewater Treatment Plant (State funding totalling \$848,000 in FY 2021 CIP) which was designed to handle the capacity of the middle and high schools.

The Northern High School Replacement project was approved for a PFA waiver at the IAC meeting on February 23, 2012, specifically noting that having both the middle and high schools reside on the same site reduces costs associated with transportation and operations and that to not utilize the existing campus infrastructure and amenities will add to the development and construction costs of that past project.

In consideration of these factors, the IAC Designees recommend approval of the PFA waiver.



Item 5. Maximum State Allocation Increase Requests - Baltimore City Public Schools

Motion:

To approve increases to the Maximum State Allocations for the Baltimore City Public Schools (City Schools):

- Cecil Elementary School #7 (PSC 30.250) Window/Door project from \$290,400 to \$961,236; and,
- 2. William Paca Elementary School #83 (PSC 30.042) Roof project from \$739,200 to \$1,575,206.

Background information:

On March 20, 2023, IAC staff received a request from City Schools to increase funding for the FY 2022 Healthy School Facility Fund (HSFF) Cecil ES #7 windows/doors project and FY 2022 HSFF William Paca ES #83 roof replacement due to bids that came in above the estimated project budget. City Schools reports that the bid increases are due to instability in construction market costs and lead times within the current construction market.

The scope of work at Cecil ES #7 is to replace windows, storefront, glazing, exterior doors and frames, hardware, and louvers. The scope of work at William Paca ES #83 is to replace the 1975 roof system with a TPO roof, including replacing all roof accessories, flashings, downspouts, roof metal, etc.

The original approved FY 2022 HSFF State funding for these projects was \$290,400 for the Cecil ES #7 window/door project and \$739,200 for the William Paca ES #83 roof project, based on the State's 96% cost share. To address the increase in the project budgets, the LEA has revised their FY 2024 CIP and submitted funding requests for these projects.

Staff recommend approval of the LEA's request.

Per the letter City Schools sent on Mach 17, 2023, City Schools has \$4,091,008 remaining in its Reserve Appropriation Fund (assuming all prior requests are funded). There are three additional projects that were previously approved as part of the FY22 Health Schools Facility Fund, but bids came in higher than approved amounts. City Schools is submitting these projects as amendments to the FY24 CIP so that Reserve Appropriations might be applied to the difference between approved amounts and bids.

City Schools requests that these reserve appropriation funds be allocated to projects in the following manner:

- 1. Allocate \$1,450,391.04 to the Morrell Park EM #220 Roof Project (PSC #30.149). Bids for this project came in higher than initial estimates. Reserve appropriation funds will be used to cover the balance between the FY22 approved amount of \$2,112,000.00, and 96% of the bid which is \$3,562,391.04.
- 2. Allocate \$697,236.48 to the Cecil E #7 Window Project (PSC #30.250). Bids for this project came in higher than initial estimates. Reserve appropriation funds will be used to cover the balance between the FY22 approved amount of \$264,000.00, and 96% of the bid which is \$961,236.48.
- 3. Allocate \$903,206.40 to the William Paca E #83 Roof Project (PSC #30.042). Bids for this project came in higher than initial estimates. Reserve appropriation funds will be used to cover the balance between the FY22 approved amount of \$672,000.00, and 96% of the bid which is \$1,575,206.40.

Based on the additional allocation requests provided above of \$3,050,833.92, the balance remaining in the City Schools' reserve contingency fund will be \$1,297,774.08. We are requesting that these funds remain in City Schools' reserve account until additional projects are approved for allocation.

Per the letter from the IAC received on March 24, 2023, City Schools has a balance of \$15,551,002 in its Reserve Appropriation Fund (assuming all prior requests are funded). City Schools previously submitted letters dated 3/17/2023 ("Reserve Appropriation Fund Application Request") and 3/20/2023 ("Reserve Appropriation Fund Application Request Addendum") based on the balance specified in the reserve fund letter dated 11/3/2022 (\$17,546,608). To account for this discrepancy, City Schools requests that the following adjustments be made to the previous requests:

1. Revoke the request to allocate \$1,450,391.04 to the Morrell Park EM #220 Roof Project (PSC #30.149).

Based on this revision, the balance remaining in the City Schools' reserve contingency fund will be \$494,959.12. We are requesting that these funds remain in City Schools' reserve account until additional projects are approved for allocation.

Item 6. FY 2024 100% Capital Improvement Program

Motion:

- To approve the Fiscal Year 2024 Capital Improvement Program as presented in the total amount of \$663,928,487, including \$658,894,758 for allocation to funding requests, \$500,000 for Department of General Services (DGS) design consultant fees, and reserving \$4,082,129 in new authorization for design/planning services and unanticipated project costs; and
- 2. To authorize the IAC staff to make minor adjustments to allocations based on calculation of the project's net state funding amount to avoid the over or under funding of a project.

Background Information:

FY 2024 Public School Construction Capital Improvement Program

In compliance with Maryland law (Education Article §5-304(b)(5), Annotated Code of Maryland), the IAC shall approve, on or after May 1 every year, public school construction projects that comprise 100% of the school construction allocation included in the capital budget bill as enacted.

The available funding for the FY 2024 CIP consists of \$484.999 million in preliminary new authorization that consists of \$216.549 million in general funds and \$268.450 million in special funds in accordance with the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan (MCCBL) of 2023, \$40 million in Supplemental Enrollment Growth and Relocatable Classroom (EGRC) funds, \$50.761 million in prior year EGRC funds for fiscal years 2016, 2021, 2022, and 2023, and \$120.567 million in LEA reserve funds.

Requests for the FY 2024 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) were submitted by 22 LEAs and the Maryland School for the Blind totaling \$982 million for 240 projects, as well as 43 requests for planning approval. See Table 1.

100% Recommendation Project Details of Note:

- 1. In accordance with the §5-303 (j)(3) of the Education Article, \$114 million of the \$120 million held in reserve for 14 jurisdictions is being recommended for allocation to eligible FY 2024 CIP projects.
- 2. Three LEAs revised their FY 2024 CIP submission to include additional eligible projects to receive additional funding within their jurisdictions target allocations (new authorization).
- 3. Funding has been included for three Baltimore County Public Schools projects which had been previously anticipated to be rescinded including Logan ES (PSC 03.110), Chesapeake Terrace ES (PSC 03.035) and Loch Raven ES (PSC 03.134) Electrical and Open Space Enclosure projects.
- 4. City Schools revised their FY 2024 CIP submission to request that:
 - a) Design funding previously recommended for Edmondson HIgh School Building #400A (PSC 30.246) and Benjamin Franklin Building #239 (PSC 30.099) be moved to Western High School #407 (PSC 30.227) and the Baltimore Polytechnic Institute #403 (PSC 30.185).
 - b) Projects that were rescinded from the FY 2022 CIP be included in the FY 2024 CIP; and, that the \$15 million rescinded from the FY 2022/2023 CIP Armistead Gardens PreK-8 School #243 (PSC 30.186) addition/renovation project be applied back to the FY 2024 CIP to cover the revised Maximum State Allocation approved by the IAC on April 20, 2023.
 - c) The Cecil Elementary School #7 (PSC 30.250) Window/Door project be funded in the FY 2024 CIP. This project received an allocation of \$290,400 through the Healthy Schools Facility Funding (HSFF) program. Due to construction market conditions, the total project budget increased to \$961,236. Staff are recommending that the difference of \$697,236 be approved for funding through the FY 2024 CIP.
 - d) The William Paca Elementary School #83 (PSC 30.042) Roof project be funded in the FY 2024 CIP. This project received an allocation of \$739,200 through the HSFF program. Due to construction market conditions, the total budget increased to \$1,575,206. Staff are recommending that the difference of \$903,206 is approved through the FY 2024 CIP.
- 5. The project status for the Northern Middle School (PSC 04.006) replacement project is being recommended for approval contingent on IAC approval of the Priority Funding Area Waiver presented at the May meeting.
- 6. The project status for current and revised FY 2024 CIP PreK & K project submissions in Carroll, Charles, and Frederick Counties was modified to provide staff with additional time to better understand each county's regional approaches and needs.
- Harford County revised their CIP submission to withdraw the request for local planning approval for the Harford Academy (PSC 12.025) replacement project and resubmitted the Homestead/Wakefield Elementary (PSC 12.022) replacement project to seek full funding.
- 8. Howard County revised their FY 2024 CIP to seek funding for structural repairs for Applications and Research Lab (PSC 13.018). The county's total submission came in below their target allocation. Funding reserved through their reserve account and FY 2024 EGRC will roll over for distribution in the FY 2025 CIP.

- 9. Maryland School for the Blind revised their FY 2024 CIP to seek planning services to replace the gymnasium/pool.
- 10. Adjustments to the proposed maximum State Allocations for four projects in Washington County have resulted in the funding being recommended reallocated to fund all of the projects in the county's FY 2024 CIP submission.
- 11. Worcester County requested that design funding be withheld until a decision on enrollment projects for Buckingham Elementary (PSC 23.007) is finalized.

Item 7. FY 2022 Healthy School Facility Fund Extension Requests

Motion:

To approve adjustments to the FY 2022 Healthy School Facility Funding project schedule by extending the:

- 1. Encumbrance deadline from June 1, 2023 to December 31, 2023;
- 2. Expenditure deadline from October 3, 2023 to August 31, 2025; and,
- 3. Last day to submit requests for reimbursement from May 1, 2024 to October 31, 2025.

Background Information:

IAC staff have received numerous requests in the past months to extend deadlines for the FY 2022 HSFF program, citing increases in bid costs, contractor availability, and lead times as factors that require additional time to complete projects.

Upon review of all requests received to date, IAC staff recommends this adjusted schedule in order to accommodate the current market conditions, allow LEAs to execute contracts and move projects forward, complete the project closeout process, and submit required documentation for final reimbursement.

Staff recommend approval of these requested extensions.



Item 8. Built to Learn Funding Approval - Caroline County Public Schools - North Caroline High School

Motion:

To approve the Built to Learn funding request from Caroline County Public Schools for the North Caroline High School (PSC 05.002) roof replacement project totaling \$4,802,284.

Background Information:

The Built to Learn (BTL) Act of 2020 became effective February 12, 2021. The Act authorizes the Maryland Stadium Authority (MSA) to sell revenue bonds to fund up to \$2.2 billion in school construction projects approved on a rolling basis by the IAC. Currently, based upon information from MSA, the IAC will base its approval on total estimated available funding of \$1.7 billion until such time as the final available amount can be determined based upon available debt service payments to support the bonds.

As shown in the table below this project has been identified as an appropriate candidate. The project consists of 103,525 square feet of roof replacement for the North Caroline HS. This work will be Phase 1 of the project and will be completed this summer. Phase 2 of the roof replacement project consists of replacement of the remaining 75,000 square feet and will be included in the FY 2025 CIP request for summer 2024 completion. IAC staff recommend approval of the project as presented for funding through the BTL program.

As a capital maintenance (systemic renovation) project, funding for this roof replacement project is based on the State's share of the LEA's estimated costs for design, construction, and FF&E and therefore does not have a full BTL computation supplemental worksheet.

Item 9. FY 2023 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Amendment - Prince George's County Public Schools - Charles H. Flowers High School

Motion:

To amend the FY 2023 CIP allocation for the Prince George's County Public School's Charles H. Flowers High School HVAC/Roof project by applying \$4,341,179 from the LEA's reserve account.

Background Information:

The IAC approved a Maximum State Allocation of \$12.483 million for the Charles H. Flowers High School (PSC 16.174) HVAC/Roof project and a partial funding allocation of \$8,141,821 in the FY 2023 CIP. Prince George's County Public Schools is seeking IAC approval to increase the FY 2023 CIP allocation for Charles H. Flowers High by transferring \$4,341,179 from the LEA's reserve account. IAC staff recommend approval of this transfer, which will fulfill the State's obligation to this project.



Item 10. FY 2023 Capital Improvement Program Project Recission- Montgomery County Public Schools - Silver Spring International Middle School

Motion:

To approve the recission of the FY 2023 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) Local Planning approval of the Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS) Silver Spring International Middle School (PSC 15.002) Addition.

Background Information:

IAC Staff received a request from MCPS to cancel the FY 2023 CIP Silver Spring International Middle School Addition project as the LEA plans to request funding through the Built to Learn Program. Staff recommend approval of the LEA's request.

Item 11. Policy to Allow the Use of Bond Proceeds for Capital Improvements in Leased Public School Buildings

Motion:

To adopt the policy as set forth in this item and to direct staff to make appropriate changes to COMAR and the IAC's Administrative Procedures Guides in accordance with this adopted policy.

Background Information:

The Blueprint for Maryland's Future is a set of laws that emerged from the recommendations of the Commission on Innovation and Excellence in Education (known as the Kirwan Commission) beginning in 2016. The Accountability and Implementation Board (AIB) is responsible for ensuring successful implementation of the Blueprint laws. One of the elements of the AIB's Comprehensive Implementation Plan, adopted December 1, 2022, is expanded access to full-day pre-kindergarten and career and technical education. Local Education Agencies have expressed to IAC staff a need for additional space for these programs and have identified leased space as a potential solution.

The leased facilities will often require capital improvements before they can be used as public school facilities. Charter school operators often lease facilities for use as their charter school facilities. These facilities also often require capital improvements before they can be used as public charter school facilities.

On January 12, 2023, the IAC directed IAC staff to develop a policy to enable the allocation of State bond proceeds to capital-improvement projects in leased facilities that are not owned by an LEA. Staff accordingly developed the proposed policy provided in this item. The policy would make capital-improvement projects in non-LEA-owned leased facilities eligible for IAC allocation of State bond proceeds so long as the stated criteria are satisfied. These criteria include a minimum 25-year lease duration and, in the case of a facility leased by a charter school, a written guarantee by the LEA that granted the charter. The policy would require the LEA to repay a prorated amount of the State allocation if the leased facility ceases for more than a 24-month period to be used for a public school purpose during the 25-year period after project closeout. State bond proceeds may not be used for operating costs such as rent payments, utility costs, or salaries.

IAC Policy: State Capital Investments in Leased Facilities

1. Need to Be Addressed by the Policy

The IAC recognizes that Local Education Agencies (LEAs) have educational space requirements that may be met by leasing facilities for a public school purpose, including but not limited to, pre-kindergarten programs, career- and college-readiness programs, and charter schools. These leased facilities may require capital improvements to create safe, healthy, and educationally sufficient spaces for public school purposes.

2. Definitions

- 2.1 "Non-LEA entity" includes but is not limited to, operators of public charter schools.
- 2.2. "Public school" includes public charter schools.
- 2.2.1. "Public school" does not include facilities used primarily for non-instructional uses such as administrative function and support services, including transportation, facilities maintenance, and warehousing.
- 2.3 "Public school purpose" means use of a facility primarily to deliver prekindergarten through Grade 12 educational programs and services to public school students.

3. Eligibility

- 3.1. LEAs may apply for funding from the Capital Improvement Program or a Pass-Through Grant, established in Chapter 344 of the Acts of 2022, for capital improvements to facilities leased by the LEA or a non-LEA entity for a public school purpose.
- 3.2. These funds may be used solely for eligible school capital improvement expenses authorized under the program from which funding is being requested.
- 3.2.1. Capital improvement expenses do not include operating expenses, including but not limited to, lease or rent payments, utilities, taxes, fees, maintenance, moveable furniture and equipment with a median useful life of less than 15 years, insurance, salaries or wages.
- 3.3. A leased facility improved using Capital Improvement Program funding or Pass-Through Grant funding shall be used for a public school purpose for a period of at least 25 years after project closeout. If a leased facility improved using these funds ceases to be used for a public school purpose earlier than 25 years after project closeout, the LEA will be subject to Section 5 (LEA Guarantee) below.
- 4. Application and Approval Procedures

- 4.1. LEAs may apply for funding using the Capital Improvement Program <u>application form</u> or the Pass-Through Grant Program <u>application form</u>.
- 4.2 Applications shall be reviewed and approved using the eligibility criteria and any other requirements of the program from which funding is being requested.
- 4.3. If a LEA applies for funding for a project in a facility leased by a non-LEA entity, the LEA shall guarantee the State investment in the facility. The LEA Guarantee provisions are in Section 5 below.

5. LEA Guarantee

- 5.1. When a LEA applies for funding for a project in a leased facility and regardless of whether the LEA or a non-LEA entity will be the tenant, the LEA shall provide an executed written guarantee to the IAC that the leased facility will be used for a public school purpose for at least 25 years after project closeout. The IAC will provide the guarantee form to the LEA as part of the application package.
- 5.2. If the leased facility ceases for more than a 24-month period to be used for a public school purpose during the 25-year period after project closeout, the LEA shall repay the State within two fiscal years a prorated amount of project funding based on the number of years between the date the leased facility ceased to be used for a public school purpose and 25 years from project closeout.

Dear Interagency Commission on School Construction:

Thank you for considering our testimony today concerning the need to adopt regulations in accordance with MD. Education Code Ann. § 5-319 as it was adopted in 2018 through HB1783.

Background

During this General Assembly session, as we reviewed proposed legislation that concerned solar installation on public schools we discovered a requirement for the Interagency Commission on School Construction (IAC) to adopt certain regulations in regard to following:

- (a) The Interagency Commission shall adopt regulations that require the design development documents for the construction or major renovation of school buildings submitted by a county board to the Interagency Commission to include:
 - (1) An evaluation of the use of solar technologies, including photovoltaic or solar water heating, based on life cycle costs; and
 - (2) If an evaluation determines that solar technologies are not appropriate for a construction or major renovation project, a report that explains why the use of the technology is not appropriate.
- (b) On or before December 31 of each year, the Interagency Commission shall submit a report on the number of public school construction and major renovation projects in each jurisdiction that use solar technologies to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly.

However, as it currently stands, this provision does not appear to have not been implemented. COMAR 13.39.02.14 governs life cycle analysis for new school construction, and there are no specific requirements in the regulation to look at solar. In fact, life cycle analysis is not even defined specifically in regulation, but the regulation relies on the DGS Procedure Manual as its mechanism for providing requirements.

We also examined the <u>DGS Procedure Manual</u> since it is what governs much of the approach to approving schools to be constructed. While the DGS Procedure manual was updated in January 2022, it has not been updated to include any requirements to examine solar installation.

While we understand that there are oversights, this is an important provision to implement, and we believe now is an opportune time to fix this.

Relationship to SB 360/HB 458

During the 2023 General Assembly session, SB 360/HB 458 was passed and is not expected to be vetoed by the Governor. It includes the following provision: "The Interagency Commission, in


coordination with the Department and the Department of General Services [DGS], shall develop life cycle cost analysis standards". (MD. Education Code Ann. § 5–327.6 (d)) In addition, it places requirements for the life cycle analysis to include the evaluation of alternative HVAC systems. These statutory requirements are similar in process to those found for evaluating solar in MD. Education Code Ann. § 5-319 that we previously discussed.

Given that the IAC is required to undertake this effort to work with DGS to update its life cycle analysis, it is the perfect time to correct the oversight of not implementing MD. Education Code Ann. § 5-319 and include the requirements to evaluate solar in the life cycle cost analysis updates that will be worked on with DGS.

Other Reasons to Act

When the requirements in MD. Education Code Ann. § 5-319 was enacted at the time the costs of many solar projects may have been too high to pencil out. Of course, this would have been positive information to have learned from we cannot go back in time to correct this oversight. This has definitely changed in the ensuing five years.

Firstly, solar has come down in price, as you can see in the following figure from the National Renewable Energy Lab:



Secondly, there are numerous government incentives that have opened up. The most important one is the installation tax credit, which, due to the passage of the Inflation Reduction Act, is now open to governments and other organizations without tax liability. There are also school-specific incentives opened up in the Climate Solutions Now Act for schools to receive an additional 5% if they are built net-zero, which is essentially impossible to achieve without solar installation. And then, there are the numerous grant programs from DOE, EPA, MEA, and others.

Finally, there are innovative financial mechanisms, such as the sale of Solar Renewable Energy Credits (SRECS), Power Purchase Agreements (PPAs), demand response programs, and community solar, which have become more common and can further offset the costs of new solar systems.

We would be shocked if LEAs, after properly evaluating all of these various factors that reduce the costs of ownership, did not determine that installation of solar was less cost to the LEA than leaving solar off of a new building. In not evaluating solar installation, it is more than likely that LEAs would be leaving federal and state money on the table to place a greater burden on taxpayers. This is why it goes beyond just the legal requirements to promulgate regulations specified by MD. Education Code Ann. § 5-319, but is a financial imperative as well.
