FY 2024 Aging Schools Program

Allocations and Application Schedule April 28, 2023

This notice serves as notification of the availability of funding through the FY 2024 <u>Aging</u> <u>Schools Program (ASP)</u>. At their meeting on April 20, 2023, the IAC approved revisions to the ASP <u>Administrative Procedures Guide</u> (APG) and the FY 2024 ASP <u>application</u> schedule.

ASP funds are distributed to the Local Education Agencies in accordance with the FY 2024 capital budget bill. In general, the funds can be utilized for capital improvements, repairs, maintenance, and deferred maintenance work at existing public school buildings and sites serving students. These funds may also be utilized to address life, safety, and public health risks that may negatively impact the well-being of the students and teachers.

Please see the IAC's ASP APG for application instructions. The FY 2024 Aging Schools Program allocations for each school system, as shown in Attachment I, total \$9.977M, which consists of \$6.109M of new authorization and \$3.868M from unexpended prior year authorizations.
