#### **DRAFT** Meeting Minutes – April 11, 2024

#### Call to Order:

Chair Edward Kasemeyer called the video-conference meeting of the Interagency Commission on School Construction to order at 9:00 a.m.

#### 1. Executive Director's Report – [Informational Only]

Executive Director Alex Donahue gave a report on two items. His first item detailed information regarding the 2024 Legislative session that was coming to a close. Executive Director Donahue informed the IAC that a number of bills are on Governor Moore's Desk for signature, and IAC staff was awaiting confirmation of their contents upon their enrollment and signature by the Governor. Executive Director Donahue also provided an update regarding the continuing discussions with Worcester County regarding the Buckingham Elementary project. He stated that IAC staff shared four scenarios that they believe could address urgent needs in Worcester County and obtain IAC funding participation, and that IAC staff is continuing to discuss the possibilities with the LEA.

#### 2. Consent Agenda – [Motion Carried]

Upon a motion by Mr. Gibbons, seconded by Ms. Lemke, the IAC voted unanimously to approve the consent agenda. Ms. Lawlah was absent.

## 3. Healthy School Facility Fund Administrative Procedures Guide and FY 2025 Application Schedule — [Motion Carried]

Deputy Director Cassandra Viscarra presented the proposed changes to the Healthy Schools Facility Fund (HSFF) Administrative Procedures Guide (APG) and the application schedule for the program for Fiscal Year 2025. Ms. Viscarra also noted that the primary changes to the HSFF APG were technical and are designed to clarify the use of the IAC's new Business Management System platform for application purposes.

Upon a motion by Ms. Lemke, seconded by Mr. League, the IAC voted unanimously to approve the FY 2025 Healthy School Facility Fund (HSFF) Administrative Procedures Guide (APG) as shown in the presented draft document and to authorize IAC staff to solicit applications from LEAs and the Maryland School for the Blind for projects that will improve the health of school facilities and to evaluate project requests based on a competitive application process. IAC staff are authorized to make non-substantive edits as necessary. Ms. Lawlah was absent for this vote.

## 4. Aging Schools Program Administrative Procedures Guide and FY 2025 Application Schedule— [Motion Carried]

Deputy Director Cassandra Viscarra presented the proposed changes to the Aging Schools Program (ASP) APG and the application schedule for the program for Fiscal Year 2025. She noted that changes to the ASP APG were similar to the changes in the HSFF APG and included minor formatting changes and edits to COMAR references.

Chair Kasemeyer clarified that the amount of money in total in the program has not changed over the years, which Ms. Viscarra confirmed. Mr. Darenberg asked why authority to approve projects under the program is delegated to IAC staff, as opposed to projects being brought to the IAC for approval. Ms. Viscarra stated that there are two programs for which the IAC has historically delegated approval authority to staff, because the LEA level allocations are pre-determined and approved by the IAC, so staff authority for approval extends only to confirming project eligibility rather than to approving funding.

Upon a motion by Vice-chair Eberhart, seconded by Mr. Gibbons, the IAC voted unanimously to;

- 1. Approve the Aging Schools Program (ASP) Administrative Procedures Guide, and to authorize IAC staff to make non substantive edits as needed;
- 2. To open the FY 2025 ASP application period and direct staff to solicit ASP projects from LEAs with a maximum total allocation of \$6,109,000 in accordance with, and contingent upon passage of, the FY 2025 State budget; and,
- 3. To delegate authority to approve eligible projects within each total LEA allocation to IAC staff and Designees, with a report of project allocations submitted to the IAC periodically at regularly scheduled meetings.

Ms. Lawlah was absent for this vote.



5. Maximum State Allocation Increase and Award of Reserve Funds — Washington County Public Schools — Williamsport High School (PSC 21.031) Electrical Replacement Project — [Motion Carried] Capital Projects Manager Lisa Vaughn presented a request for a Maximum State Allocation increase and award of reserve funds for the Washington County Public Schools (WCPS) Williamsport High School electrical replacement project. Ms. Vaughn informed the IAC that WCPS indicated that the bids received by the LEA were higher than anticipated, and that market increases largely affected the budget of this project.

Upon a motion by Mr. Darenberg, seconded by Vice-chair Eberhart, the IAC voted unanimously to increase the Maximum State Allocation for the Washington County Williamsport High School (PSC 21.031) Electrical Distribution Replacement project from \$377,000 to \$592,500 in accordance with COMAR 14.39.02.07 and to transfer \$215,500 from the LEA's reserve funds to the FY 2023 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) project. Ms. Lawlah was absent for this vote.

6. Gross Area Baseline Variance — Calvert County Public Schools — Northern Middle School (PSC 04.006) Replacement Project — [Motion Carried]

Ms. Vaughn also presented the request for a Gross Area Baseline (GAB) adjustment for Calvert County Public Schools (CCPS) for the Northern Middle School Replacement project. Ms. Vaughn indicated that IAC Staff supported the request for additional square footage due to middle schools utilizing a team-based structure for education, the lower number of students attending the school resulting in a lower than typical utilization rate, and classrooms which require equipment that is needed at all middle schools regardless of size.

Mr. Darenberg inquired as to whether or not this was a specialty middle school, or if the facility just required standard equipment for particular 'specials' such as art, music, etc. Ms. Vaughn informed the IAC that this was not a specialty middle school and that the equipment is typically needed for these particular subjects in middle schools. Executive Director Donahue added that while GABs are built on more of a traditional education approach, similar to high schools, some middle schools observe more of a team-based approach similar to that of elementary schools which requires more space and reduces full utilization of all spaces.

Upon a motion by Mr. Darenberg, seconded by Mr. League, the IAC voted unanimously to approve a Gross Area Baseline (GAB) variance for an additional 3,857 gross square feet (GSF) at Calvert County's Northern Middle School (PSC 04.006) which increases the eligible building area from 101,219 to 105,076 GSF based upon an eligible enrollment of 692 students.

7. Built to Learn Funding Request — Calvert County Public Schools — Northern Middle School (PSC 04.006) Replacement Project — [Motion Carried]

Funding Programs Assistant Deterrion Sims presented the request from CCPS asking that all \$13.5 million of the Built to Learn (BTL) allocation for CCPS be applied to the Northern Middle School Replacement project. Ms. Sims also indicated that staff was also recommending the Northern Middle Replacement Project for funding under the Capital Improvement Program (CIP) for FY 2025 during the May 9, 2024 IAC Meeting.

Chair Kasemeyer asked how this project came to be requested by the LEA, to which Ms. Sims indicated that the LEA had previously wanted to fund another project, but that this project was more pressing to CCPS. Executive Director Donahue added that the Built to Learn Program is a multi-year



program in which each LEA receives a total earmarked amount which they could choose to put toward a number of projects. Some LEAs have requested approval to spend all of this money already, however, others, such as CCPS, have not yet used all funds. IAC Staff has been working with these LEAs to use this remaining funding to fund the most pressing projects.

Upon a motion by Ms. Lemke, seconded by Vice-chair Eberhart, the IAC voted unanimously to approve Calvert County Public Schools' (CCPS) request for Built to Learn (BTL) construction funding for the Northern Middle School replacement project totaling \$13,566,212.

## 8. Gross Area Baseline Variance — Garrett County Public Schools — Broad Ford Elementary/Southern Middle School (PSC 11.008) — [Motion Carried]

Lead Capital Projects Manager Eugene Shanholtz presented the request for a GAB variance from Garrett County Public Schools (GCPS) for their Southern Middle School/Broad Ford Elementary School project. Mr. Shanholtz indicated that the two schools are located on the same plot of land, and the requested project proposes to demolish the current elementary building and modify the current middle school to be a PreK-6 facility. Modifications to decrease the size of these spaces would be cost prohibitive. Additionally, GCPS has established an alternative education program, the Students Taking Active Responsibility for Success (STARS) which will be housed in the renovated building. This square footage allocation for alternative education is not accounted for in existing GAB methodology.

Upon a motion by Dr. Wright, seconded by Mr. League, the IAC voted unanimously to approve a Gross Area Baseline (GAB) variance for an additional 5,527 gross square feet (GSF) at Garrett County's Broad Ford Elementary/Southern Middle School (PSC 11.008) renovation and addition project. This increases the eligible building area from 100,661 to 106,188 gross square feet based upon an eligible enrollment of 774 students.

## 9. Built to Learn Funding Request — Garrett County Public Schools — Broad Ford Elementary/Southern Middle School (PSC 11.008) — [Motion Carried]

Ms. Sims presented the request from GCPS asking that all \$3.1 million of their Built to Learn (BTL) allocation be applied to the Southern Middle School/Broad Ford Elementary project. Ms. Sims also indicated that staff will likely recommend the project for funding under the CIP for FY 2025 during the May 9, 2024 IAC Meeting.

Upon a motion by Mr. League, seconded by Mr. Gibbons, the IAC voted unanimously to approve Garrett County Public Schools' (GCPS) request for Built to Learn (BTL) construction funding for the Broad Ford Elementary/Southern Middle School renovation and addition project totaling \$3,162,862.

## 10. Built to Learn Funding Request — Talbot County Public Schools — Chapel District Elementary School (PSC 20.006) Renovation/Addition Project — [Motion Carried]

Funding Programs and Finance Assistant Tatyana Tate presented the request from Talbot County Public Schools (TCPS) that the entirety of their BTL funding, totalling approximately \$3.8 million, be applied to the Chapel District Elementary School Renovation/Addition project. Ms. Tate also indicated that staff will likely recommend additional funding through the CIP for FY 2025 during the May 9, 2024 IAC Meeting.



Upon a motion by Dr. Wright, seconded by Ms. Lemke, the IAC voted unanimously to approve Talbot County Public Schools' (TCPS) request for Built to Learn (BTL) construction funding for the Chapel District Elementary School (PSC 20.006) renovation/addition project totaling \$3,878,801.

## 11. FY 2024 Healthy Schools Facility Fund Realignment and Reversion Request — Carroll County Public Schools — [Motion Carried]

Ms. Sims presented a request from Carroll County Public Schools to rescind the \$2,240,000 FY 2024 HSFF award for the window replacement project at Westminster High School, and to reallocate this funding to two other projects. Ms. Sims also notes that since the HSFF program is a competitive grant program, that the remaining money not being reallocated to other projects is recommended by IAC Staff to be reverted back to the HSFF Reserve Account for reallocation at a future date.

Upon a motion by Mr. Darenberg, seconded by Mr. League, the IAC voted unanimously to

- 1. Cancel the FY 2024 Healthy School Facility Fund (HSFF) Carroll County Public Schools (CCPS) Westminster High School Window project, totaling \$2,240,000, and to;
- 2. Reallocate \$1,435,000 to the FY 2023 HSFF Oklahoma Road Middle School HVAC project;
- 3. Reallocate \$211,996 to the FY 2023 HSFF North Carroll Middle School Roof Replacement project; and
- 4. Rescind the remaining \$593,004 to the Statewide Healthy School Facility reserve fund for reallocation.

## 12. Disposal of State-Owned Relocatable Unit #533-08 and Funding for Demolition — St. Mary's County Public Schools — [Motion Carried]

Mr. Shanholtz presented the request for approval of the disposal of state owned relocatable #533-08, currently in the possession of St. Mary's County, and to provide partial funding contingent with the State Cost Share totalling \$30,333 to dispose of the unit. Mr. Shanholtz indicated that the LEA had the unit inspected, and given the extensive repairs required, the most affordable course of action is demolition. Additionally, since the unit was built initially in January of 1987, the unit is well past its expected useful life.

Mr. Darenberg expressed concern over the cost of disposal, indicating that he remembered a past disposal of a relocatable being significantly less. Mr. Shanholtz indicated that the higher cost was largely due to the presence of asbestos-containing material, which has to be disposed of in a particular way to prevent hazards to both workers and those around the site of demolition. Mr. Darenberg also inquired about how many units were currently left in the state, and Executive Director Donahue informed the IAC that the state inventory is currently around 100 units, and that the average age is quite high, with the cost to demolish being significantly less than repurposing the units or repairing them. Ms. Lemke inquired as to what the average expected useful life is for a relocatable unit, to which Executive Director Donahue indicated that the IAC's guideline is 15 years for a relocatable unit and 20 years for a modular unit.

Upon a motion by Dr. Wright, seconded by Mr. Gibbons, the IAC heard the motion to;



- Approve the disposal of State-Owned Relocatable Unit #533-08 stationed at the
  Department of Supporting Services Campus behind Benjamin Banneker Elementary School
  in St. Mary's County Public Schools (SMCPS) for the purposes of demolition; and,
- 2. To, upon approval of the disposal of the unit by the Department of General Services (DGS), provide demolition funding totalling \$30,333 from the Statewide Relocatable Repair Fund, a subset of the Statewide reserves.


The motion was passed, with all members voting in the affirmative except Mr. Darenberg, who voted in the negative.

Upon the Owner's approval of the design, the Architect shall prepare Construction Documents indicating requirements for construction of the Project and shall coordinate its services with any consulting services the Owner provides. The Architect shall assist the Owner in filing documents required for the approval of governmental authorities, in obtaining bids or proposals, and in awarding contracts for construction.

- .4 Workers' Compensation at statutory limits.
- .5 Employers' Liability with policy limits not less than One Million Dollars (\$\$1,000,000) each accident, One Million Dollars (\$ 1,000,000 ) each employee, and One Million Dollars (\$ 1,000,000 ) policy limit.
- .6 Professional Liability covering negligent acts, errors and omissions in the performance of professional services with policy limits of not less than Four Million Dollars (\$ 4,000,000 ) per claim and Eight Million Dollars (\$8,000,000) in the aggregate.
- .7 Additional insured Obligations. To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Architect shall cause the primary and excess or umbrella polices for Commercial General Liability and Automobile Liability to include the Owner as an additional insured for claims caused in whole or in part by the Architect's negligent acts or omissions. The additional insured coverage shall be primary and non-contributory to any of the Owner's insurance policies and shall apply to both ongoing and completed operations.

Documents incorporated as part of this Agreement:

1. Architect's Fee Proposal dated April 13, 2023.

#### ARTICLE 7 SUPPLEMENTARY GENERAL CONDITIONS

These Supplementary General Conditions shall take precedence over any other term(s) in the Contract, including all of its Addenda, Attachments and any subsequent Change Orders (collectively "the Contract") dated entered into between the Board of Education for Dorchester County, as Owner, and Crabtree, Rohrbaugh & Associates as design professional ("Designer"). In the event of any discrepancy or conflict between the terms of these Supplementary General Conditions and any term(s) of the Contract, the terms of these Supplementary General Conditions shall take precedence and shall govern.

#### 1.0 DISPUTES

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Any disputes between parties to the Contract which do not reach amicable settlement shall be tried exclusively in State Civil Court in Dorchester County, Maryland. The parties waive any right to trial by jury in any civil case. The Designer shall carry on the work and maintain the Progress Schedule, during any disputes, unless otherwise directed by the Owner.

#### 2.0 DESIGN ERRORS AND/OR OMISSIONS

- (a) The Owner shall not be responsible to pay, and the DESIGNER shall not be entitled to receive, any compensation for services which are required as a result of the errors, omissions or negligence of the DESIGNER or its consultants, or as a result of the DESIGNER's willful misconduct or failure to perform in accordance with the terms of this Agreement. Moreover, the DESIGNER will be responsible, at no cost to the Owner, for correcting documents exhibiting design errors or omissions.
- (b) The DESIGNER'S liability for errors, omissions or negligence with regard to payment or fees which may otherwise be due under the terms of this Agreement in the event the Owner sustains any costs, expenses or other damages as result of the errors, omissions or negligence of the DESIGNER or its consultants, or as a result of the DESIGNER's negligence, malpractice, errors and/or omissions or failure to perform in accordance with the terms of this Agreement shall be determined by the Agreement's Dispute Resolution procedures.
- (c) With regard to construction costs incurred by Owner to correct DESIGNER's errors, DESIGNER will be responsible for all resulting costs except for those which the Owner would have incurred had there been no errors.

#### Item 2.C Project Allocation Reversion

#### **Motion:**

To revise the contract approval for St. Mary's County Public Schools' Town Creek Elementary School (PSC 18.014) HVAC Project, approved by the IAC on October 13, 2022, to revert \$464,640 to the reserve account for St. Mary's County

#### **Background Information:**

The IAC approved a contract award totalling \$3,392,000 between St. Mary's County Public Schools (SMCPS) and Paramount Mechanical Corporation, which left an award balance of \$464,640. The contract approval included \$1,424,640 of local funds and \$1,967,360 of State funds.

SMCPS requests that the contract award be amended to revert the remaining project award of \$464,640 to the LEA's reserve account.



Item 2.D Cancellation of Contract Award - Baltimore City Public Schools- Maree G. Farring Elementary/Middle School Annex (PSC 30.286) Renovation/Addition Project

#### **Motion:**

To approve the cancellation of the contract awarded to Plano-Coudon, LLC for construction funding for the Baltimore City Public Schools Maree G. Farring Elementary/Middle School Annex (PSC 30.286) Renovation/Addition project.

#### **Background Information:**

On July 13, 2023 the IAC approved a contract between Baltimore City Public Schools (City Schools) and Plano-Coudon, LLC in the amount of \$18,809,000 for construction of the Renovation/Addition project at Maree G. Farring Elementary/Middle School Annex (PSC 30.286).

On February 20, 2024, City Schools requested to rescind FY 2023 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) funding and amend the FY 2024 CIP to resubmit the project. This request was approved by the IAC at their March 14, 2024 meeting. However, the approved item did not contain a motion to cancel the existing contract that the IAC had awarded at the July 13, 2023 IAC meeting. Cancellation of the contract is required in order to perform the rescission of FY 2023 funding and reallocation of FY 2024 funding approved by the IAC.

IAC staff anticipate recommending approval of the contract on the FY 2024 CIP project at the June 13, 2024 IAC meeting.

IAC staff recommend approval of this correction.



#### Item 3. FY 2025 Capital Improvement Program 100% Recommendations

#### **Motion:**

- To approve the Fiscal Year 2025 Capital Improvement Program as presented in the total amount of \$363.3 million including \$358.8 million for allocation to funding requests, \$500,000 for Department of General Services (DGS) design consultant fees, and reserving \$3.9 million in new authorization for design/planning services and unanticipated project costs; and,
- 2. To authorize the IAC staff to make minor adjustments to allocations based on calculation of the project's Maximum State Allocation amount to avoid the over-or under-funding of a project.

#### **Background Information:**

#### FY 2025 Public School Construction Capital Improvement Program (CIP)

In compliance with Education Article §5-304(b)(5), Annotated Code of Maryland; "on or after May 1 every year, the Interagency Commission shall approve 100% of the school construction allocation included in the capital budget bill as enacted."

The available funding for the FY 2025 CIP consists of \$313.891 million in preliminary new authorization in accordance with the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan (MCCBL) of 2024, \$40 million in Supplemental Enrollment Growth and Relocatable Classroom (EGRC) funds, \$25.917 million in prior year EGRC funds for Fiscal Years 2016, 2023, 2024, and \$9.172 million in LEA reserve funds.

Requests for the FY 2025 CIP were submitted by 24 Local Education Agencies (LEAs) and the Maryland School for the Blind totaling \$997 million for 270 projects, as well as requests for planning approval. See Table 1.

This year's CIP is different from many past years' CIPs in that the number of Local Planning (LP) approvals that can be granted while staying within the bounds of projected future-year appropriations is very small. This is due to the large number of projects that the IAC approved during the past two years under the Built to Learn (BTL) and CIP programs, which will draw down approximately \$500 million in expected State appropriations over the coming years.

### 100% Recommendation Project Details of Note:

- 1. IAC staff's recommendation of funding for the Anne Arundel County Public Schools Priority #8 Glen Burnie High (PSC 02.020) Roof Phase 3 project is contingent upon approval of Item 4 in this agenda.
- 2. Baltimore County Public Schools':
  - Priority #1 New Northeast Area High School (PSC 03.225) project status changed from a "C" (Deferred due to outstanding issues) to an "A", and funding for early planning activities is recommended.
  - Priority #6 New Northwest Area Career & Technical Education Center (PSC 30.227) project status changed from a "C" (Deferred due to outstanding issues) to an "A", and funding for early planning activities is recommended.
- 3. Calvert County Public Schools' Northern Middle School (PSC 04.006) Replacement project recommended funding has been reduced, per the Calvert County Board of Education request to fully fund the Northern High School (PSC 04.005) Air Handling Units project. The existing Northern Middle School boiler currently serves the Mary Harrison Center wing of Northern High School. Demolition of the existing boiler will leave the Mary Harrison Center wing of Northern High School without heat. As such, the project at Northern High School needs to move forward in order to not create a disruption in climate control in the colder months within this section of Northern High School.
- 4. Carroll County Public Schools' project statuses changed from a "B" (Deferred due to fiscal constraints) to an "A" to fund design services for:

- Priority #10 Cranberry Station Elementary (PSC 06.046) PreK/Kindergarten Addition.
- Priority #13 Friendship Valley Elementary (PSC 06.038) PreK/Kindergarten Addition.
- Priority #16 Taneytown Elementary (PSC 06.016) PreK/Kindergarten Addition.
- 5. The Charles County Public Schools La Plata High School (PSC 08.013)
  Addition/Renovation project is undergoing a significant change in project scope. As such, Charles County Public Schools has requested partial funding be applied to their next priority J.C. Parks Elementary (PSC 08.030) PreK/Kindergarten
  Addition/Renovation project. The balance of funding is anticipated to be requested in a future CIP.
- 6. Dorchester County Public Schools:
  - Priority #7 Warwick/Hurlock Elementary (PSC 09.011) Replacement project status has been changed from a "C" for design services funding due to outstanding issues status to an "A" status to fund early planning services that includes the development of Educational Specifications and a Feasibility Study. This recommendation is contingent upon approval of Item 5 in this agenda.
  - Priority #8 Sandy Hill/Hurlock Elementary (PSC 09.001) Replacement project status has been changed from a "C" for design services funding due to outstanding issues status to an "A" status to fund early planning services that includes the development of Educational Specifications and a Feasibility Study. This recommendation is contingent upon approval of Item 5 in this agenda.
  - Priority #9 Mace's Lane Middle (PSC 09.015) Roof project status has been changed from an "A" to a "B" for design services funding and applied to fully fund a higher priority project. This recommendation is contingent upon approval of Item 6 in this agenda.
- 7. The Maximum State Allocation of \$68,451,000 for Frederick County Public School's Priority #4 Middletown Elementary/Middle (PSC 10.085) Replacement project is contingent on the Maryland State Department of Education's confirmation that the eligible number of special education elementary students is 50 and the final Cooperative Use Space calculation is determined.
- 8. Garrett County Public School's Priority #1 and #2 Broad Ford Elementary/Southern Middle (PSC 11.008) Renovation/Addition project is being recommended for a substantial State investment to ensure that the State provides an adequate amount of funding to support cash flow needs that will allow the project to move forward.
- 9. Maryland School for the Blind's (PSC 25.001) Priority #1 and #2 Athletic Facilities Gymnasium and Pool replacement project is being recommended for planning approval and design services.
- 10. Montgomery County Public School's Priorities #18, #19, and #20 New Crown High School (PSC 15.284) Replacement project statuses have changed from an "U" to an "A" as the issues pertaining to enrollments and adjacent schools have now been resolved.
- 11. Prince George's County Public School's Priorities #1 and #2 Cool Spring Elementary (PSC 16.134) Replacement Project statuses have changed from "U" to "A" as design progress is being made. This project is being recommended for planning approval and first-time construction funding.
- 12. Wicomico County Public School's Priority #2 Fruitland Primary (PSC 22.016)
  Replacement project is being recommended for partial design services funding.

13. Worcester County Public School's Snow Hill Middle School (PSC 23.009) Roof project has received bids. An adjustment to the Maximum State Allocation has been made at the request of the LEA and based on current bid results increases the State's participation in this project.

Item 5. FY 2023 Capital Improvement Program Amendment Request – Dorchester County Public Schools – Vienna Elementary School (PSC 09.005) HVAC Project

#### **Motion:**

To rescind the FY 2023 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) funding awarded to Dorchester County Public Schools' (DCPS) Vienna Elementary School (PSC 09.005) HVAC project totaling \$2,232,000 and transfer the funding to the Local Education Agency's (LEA's) reserve account for future use.

#### **Background Information:**

The DCPS Board of Education has requested that the funding awarded to the Vienna Elementary School HVAC project be rescinded as the LEA has determined that the project will not be pursued due to shifting long-term priorities to support the implementation of requirements specified in the Blueprint for Education.

The LEA has requested that a portion of the funds be reassigned to their FY 2025 CIP to develop Educational Specification standards and perform elementary school feasibility studies to determine the best use of future funding, as included in Item 3 of this agenda.

IAC staff recommend approval of the LEA's request.



Item 6. Maximum State Allocation and FY 2023 Capital Improvement Program Increase
- Montgomery County Public Schools - Sligo Middle School (PSC 15.235)

**HVAC Replacement Project** 

#### **Motion:**

To increase the Maximum State Allocation for Montgomery County Public Schools' (MCPS) Sligo Middle School (PSC 15.235) HVAC project from \$4,500,000 to \$6,180,000 and to transfer \$1,680,000 from the LEA's reserve fund account to the FY 2023 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) project, in accordance with COMAR 14.39.02.07.

#### **Background Information:**

On April 9, 2024, MCPS received bid results for the HVAC replacement system at Sligo Middle Schools that were higher than expected. Due to local resources being stretched across multiple school projects, MCPS is requesting that the Maximum State Allocation be amended to meet the increase in the project cost and that funding from the LEA's reserve account be utilized to supplement the difference in project costs. This funding increase would allow for a total of \$6.18 million in State funding for the project.

COMAR 14.39.02.07 states; "the IAC may increase the maximum state construction allocation for a systemic renovation project when the LEA has sufficient reserve funds available...", provided that the LEA submits the final project scope of work, and a cost estimate or the bid tabulation for the project.

IAC staff recommend approval of the LEA's request.

The Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS) approved FY 2023 State Capital Improvements Program (CIP) included \$4.5 million for the Sligo Middle School HVAC Replacement project. Item 7. Built to Learn Funding Request – Montgomery County Public Schools –
Burtonsville Elementary School (PSC 15.285) Replacement Project

#### **Motion:**


To approve Montgomery County Public Schools' (MCPS) request for Built to Learn (BTL) construction funding for the Burtonsville Elementary School (PSC 15.285) Replacement project totaling \$29,907,000.

#### **Background Information:**

The Built To Learn Act of 2020 became effective February 12, 2021. The Act authorizes the Maryland Stadium Authority (MSA) to sell revenue bonds to fund up to \$2.2 billion in school construction projects approved on a rolling basis by the IAC. Currently, based upon information from MSA, the IAC will base its approval on total estimated available funding of \$1.7 billion until such time that the MSA informs the IAC that its estimate of availability based upon available debt service payments to support the bonds has changed.

Because MCPS is eligible for up to 150% of the Gross Area Baseline for Built to Learn projects in accordance with the Built to Learn Act, the potential eligible project square footage is up to 141,368 square feet. In this case, the project eligibility is capped at the actual project scope because it is less than the potential eligible amount. MCPS is requesting BTL funding to replace Burtonsville Elementary School, including demolition of the existing 71,349 gross square foot (GSF) school (PSC 15.052) and construction of 99,038 GSF on a new site (PSC 15.285) based upon 762 eligible students. Based on the LEA's requested scope and the State cost share of 55%, which includes the maintenance add-on, the Maximum State Allocation for the project is \$29,907,000.

IAC staff recommend approval of the LEA's request.





Item 8. Built to Learn Funding Request – Montgomery County Public Schools – Greencastle Elementary School (PSC 15.155) Renovation/Addition Project

#### **Motion:**

To approve Montgomery County Public Schools' (MCPS) request for Built to Learn (BTL) construction funding for the Greencastle Elementary School (PSC 15.155) Renovation/Addition Project totaling \$7,727,000.

#### **Background Information:**

The Built To Learn Act of 2020 became effective February 12, 2021. The Act authorizes the Maryland Stadium Authority (MSA) to sell revenue bonds to fund up to \$2.2 billion in school construction projects approved on a rolling basis by the IAC. Currently, based upon information from MSA, the IAC will base its approval on total estimated available funding of \$1.7 billion until such time that the MSA informs the IAC that its estimate of availability based upon available debt service payments to support the bonds has changed.

Because MCPS is eligible for up to 150% of the Gross Area Baseline for Built to Learn projects in accordance with the Built to Learn Act, the potential eligible square footage for renovation is 78,275 gross square feet (GSF), and potential eligible square footage for addition is 20,252 GSF. In this case, the project eligibility is capped at the actual project scope because it is less than the potential eligible amount. MCPS is requesting BTL funding for a renovation/addition project at Greencastle Elementary School, an addition of 15,305 GSF and renovation of 10,806 GSF to accommodate the 446 eligible students. Based on the Local Education Agency's (LEA's) requested scope and the State cost share of 60%, which includes the Concentration of Poverty and maintenance add-ons, the Maximum State Allocation for the project is \$7,727,000.

IAC staff recommend approval of the LEA's request.

Item 9. FY 2020 Healthy Schools Facility Fund Rescission Request – Calvert County Public Schools – Mt. Harmony Elementary School (PSC 04.007) Boiler Project

#### Motion:

To rescind the \$62,010 awarded through the FY 2020 Healthy School Facility Fund (HSFF) for Calvert County Public Schools' (CCPS) Mt. Harmony Elementary School (PSC 04.007) boiler replacement project.

#### **Background Information:**

CCPS was awarded funding through the FY 2020 HSFF at the September 12, 2019 IAC meeting to replace the boilers at Mt. Harmony Elementary School. However, due to local fiscal constraints, CCPS is unable to move forward with the project and has requested that the funding be rescinded. Since requests for funding through the HSFF are awarded to school construction projects on a competitive basis, reverted funds are transferred to the Statewide HSFF reserve account for reallocation to other eligible projects.

IAC staff recommend approval of the Local Education Agency's request.

# Legislative Update and FY 2025 Budget

Presentation to the Interagency Commission on School Construction

Public Schools - Public School Construction -Funding and Administration





- Removes the sunset date from the School Safety Grant Program, allowing the program to continue indefinitely
- Increases the State cost-share to 100% for projects that meet certain criteria:
  - FY 2025 State cost share < 55%</li>
  - < 60k FTE in Sep. 2023</li>
  - Project is a major renovation
  - Planning and design occur in FY 25 or 26

#### **IAC Role:**

- The IAC currently does, and will continue to administer the School Safety Grant Program in collaboration with MCSS.
- The IAC will be required to amend any COMAR language with circumstances by which a project may be given a 100% state share.
- Requires the IAC to report by December 15, 2024 on the eligibility of Al weapon detection systems
- IAC Chair is a member of the Workgroup on the Assessment and Funding of School Facilities



## HB 1390 (cont.)

- Prince George's County P3 Changes
- Delays the Nancy K. Kopp Public School Facilities Priority Fund one year to FY 2028
- Provides funding in FY 2027 for uses similar to the Healthy School Facility Fund
- Clarifies that the legislative intent language establishing a target of \$450m per year for school construction does not include Built to Learn Funding

- Reestablishes the Workgroup on the Assessment and Funding of School Facilities
  - Workgroup is to meet after June 1, 2025
  - Determine how to prioritize assessment results and how to incorporate them into school funding decisions
  - Report findings by January 1, 2026
  - Requires Prince George's County to prioritize High Point HS after New Northern Adelphi Area HS.



Education - School Mapping Data Program - Established





- Allows local school systems to apply for funding to produce school mapping data.
- Safe Schools fund (MCSS managed) can be used to pay for mapping of school facilities
- Maps must be digitally compatible and contain site specific labeling
- Maps must be verified for accuracy

#### **IAC Role:**

"...Adopt facility mapping standards for the uniform mapping of physical attributes of public schools in the State."

IAC staff will work with the Center for School Safety and other appropriate State and local partners to develop proposed standards.



## HB 1440, HB 1450, and SB 114

## **County Bills**

- HB 1440: Requires the Howard County BOE to publish a report detailing any discrepancies between the HCBOE Capital Budget proposal and the County Superintendent's proposal.
- HB 1450: Creates a task force to study revenue options for school needs and identify funding gaps in Howard County.
- SB 114: Creates a workgroup to study the viability of P3s in Calvert County.
- HB 1016: Establishes a workgroup for Frederick County School Construction planning.

#### **IAC Role:**

The Chair of the IAC, or the Chair's Designee, is required to serve on the Calvert County Workgroup established in SB 114.

One member of the IAC is required to serve on the Frederick County Workgroup established in HB 1016.

Dear Interagency Commission on School Construction:

Thank you for considering our testimony concerning the need to adopt updated life-cycle cost analysis documents as required by HB458. Climate Parents is a campaign to reduce climate change-causing pollution in our schools, and our group is active in Prince George's County. In particular, we recently worked directly with Prince George's County Public Schools (PGCPS) technical staff, elected officials, and other advocates to develop a Climate Change Action Plan for PGCPS as part of a focus work group created by the Board of Education.

During the 2023 General Assembly session, the Maryland General Assembly passed HB 458, which was subsequently signed by Governor More. HB 458 was sponsored by Delegate Jazz Lewis (HD-24). This bill dealt with several issues involving school construction, but with this letter, we are concerned with § 5-327(d), the requirement that "The Interagency Commission, in coordination with the Department of General Services [(DGS)], shall develop life-cycle cost analysis standards." The effective date for the portion of the law in concern is July 1, 2023.

Life-cycle analysis is an important requirement for many reasons when it comes to constructing long-term capital assets like schools. Firstly, schools have long-term operations and maintenance (O&M) costs that need to be adequately accounted for in planning since upfront cost savings in construction may come at long-term costs in terms of increased O&M that result in greater costs to the taxpayer over time than would have otherwise occurred. Secondly, fossil fuel energy use, in particular, comes with negative impacts on student health and the climate, and these need to be factored into the decisions about how to construct new schools. Finally, Maryland, through the Climate Solutions Now Act, has set a deadline for our economy to be net zero by 2045, which is in line with climate science. Equipment that otherwise has a physical life-cycle of more than 20 years (such as a boiler) will no longer be able to be used for its entire useful life.

At this point, we have not seen any publication of drafts for public comment or life-cycle analysis standards that were developed in coordination with DGS. We realize that you are likely working on this already, but this is important work that LEAs need in order to ensure cost-effective and sustainable school construction. We do urge the IAC to publish a draft of its new life-cycle analysis standards so that the public can comment on this vital work.

When the standards are updated, it is important to include several factors related to climate planning beyond what is currently being considered:

• Fossil fuel equipment should not be given a useful life that extends beyond 2045 since that is the date for which Maryland will be net-zero under the Climate Solutions Now Act.

- The cost to retrofit buildings with EV charging before 2045 should be considered compared to the cost of making a building EV-ready.
- Cost decisions must factor in refundable tax credits and state incentives that will offset the upfront costs of solar, heat pumps, and energy efficiency.
- Cost savings from solar installation should be weighed in the long-term operating costs.
